Fr. Steve's article continued...About the Catholic Advocacy Network: Last October on "Life and Dignity Sunday," we were all invited to sign up to receive emails from the Minnesota Catholic Conference (MCC) concerning upcoming legislative action that can use your voice as members of the Catholic Community. Advocacy is part of social justice, being a voice for those who have no voice. Some people said that they have not received any emails from MCC, even though they signed up to receive them. Keep in mind that you will not receive a lot of them when there is no working session...and they are sent when we need to know something upon which we are invited to add our voices. Here are some things to check if you have not received any: 1) Check to see if you are receiving emails from the Catholic Advocacy Network (CAN). MCC emails come to us under the heading of CAN...NOT the MCC. 2) Check your spam folder. Sometimes the MCC emails get tucked into the spam mail category. 3) If you have run the above checks and still cannot locate MCC or CAN email, send a note to Bernie Cullen (our ambassador) at bmbjc2@gctel.net and he will follow up on this for you.

FOLLOWING CHRIST

If you've ever had an unpleasant but somewhat amusing practical joke played on you, then you have some understanding of how Jeremiah feels today when he tells God "good one—you duped me." We can almost see him shaking his head with a bit of a rueful smile, but an angry undertone in his voice. In similar fashion, Peter thinks Jesus is "duping" him when Jesus starts to explain that being Messiah means suffering and dying, and being a follower of the Messiah means taking up a cross and doing the same. Jeremiah tries to deny God's will for him by trying to shut up; Peter—who has just been made the foundation of the church—out and out denies the teaching of Jesus, for which he is named "Satan" today. Fortunately for us, Jeremiah comes to realize that to have the word of God placed in your heart means that it will be futile to try and keep silent, even if it means scorn and derision from those around you. Luckily Peter ultimately returned to the faith he professed in last week's Gospel, and came to understand our need as baptized followers of Christ to follow in his way, even when it means following him to our verv death.

LITURGICAL & MUSICAL NOTES

Does God want us to be happy?

Does God want us to be happy? How could anyone answer 'no'?

How could anyone suppose God is loving if it is not true that he wants us to be happy?

And yet look at Christ's line in the <u>Gospel</u> Reading. Deny yourself, Jesus tells his faithful followers; take up your cross and follow me.

Denying yourself seems the opposite of going for happiness, doesn't it? And the cross is an instrument of torture. Why would God want these things for his people? Does God want us to be *unhappy?*

A man divorcing his dowdy wife to marry a much younger, prettier woman explained his decision to his devastated wife this way: "God wants me to be happy," he told her, "and I can't be happy with you. I will be happy with her."

It seems never to have crossed the mind of this man that God might have any care for the happiness of his wife. As far as his wife was concerned, the husband's full view of the matter could be put this way: "God wants *me* to be happy, but God doesn't give a damn about *you*."

This little story is common in its selfishness. But we should not let our familiarity with its callous disregard for the suffering of others blind us. Whether it is these familiar evils or the terrible shocking evils we see in the news, these evils show us the sickness of the post-fall human condition. We are willing to privilege our own power or pleasure over any greater goods, even at the cost of cruelty to others.

We can't be happy in *this* condition. No one can be happy whose heart has deep within it a willingness to crush others to get what he wants.

Well, then, what is to be done with us? What will make us happy? What will save us from the evil that infects us and leaves us so willing to afflict others?

This is where Christ's cross comes into the story. Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. (Jn 14:6) The cross of Christ is our only route to the happiness God does want for us.

Taking up our cross with Christ is healing for our sinful condition. It is the way to life, and to true joy.
