REVEREND HONORATUS MWAGENI, RWANDAN MISSIONARY



My name is Fr. Honoratus Mwageni. I was born and raised in Tanzania. I went to Rwanda as a missionary in 1997 after the horrible genocide that took place in 1994. The genocide claimed many lives of people; priests were not spared. There was a great cry for help from the bishops of Rwanda asking for priests from neighboring countries to come and help. I answered that call and went to serve in the Diocese of Butare, which I still serve. Currently I am in the Chicago area, while I preach for the *Missionary Cooperative Plan* in which you participate. Over the years there, I have witnessed how God's grace works in his people to help them to forgive one another, to reconcile and to live together in peace. It is my joy to see how Rwanda has resurrected from the ashes in a way that no one could ever have imagined. This happened because of the faith the Rwandans possess and with the support of all people of good will. This gives me the strength and the hope to continue doing this mission, believing that with God all things are possible.

Rwanda is a small country situated in the heart of Africa. In 1994 it experienced a horrific genocide that was politically motivated, during which one million people were savagely murdered in 100 days. The genocide left behind many orphans and widows, all traumatized. Infrastructures like schools, medical centers, even churches were destroyed. The economy of the country was likewise destroyed, setting back the development of this already poor and struggling country. Thanks be to God, now there is security in the country. The challenge is to rebuild the nation and to help people to recover from genocide.

In the years since the genocide, the Diocese of Butare has focused its outreach to the youth, the future of Rwanda, impressing upon them the themes of unconditional love, peace and reconciliation so that the country may heal. The diocese accomplishes this through Catholic education, as they not only teach essential courses, but also the Catholic faith, helping to form consciences based on Christian values. This has made a great difference, contributing to the building of a new Church and nation we see today. The church in Rwanda is flourishing. 60% of the country's population is Catholic. Many young men and women are responding to God's call to priestly and religious life. There is a brighter future for the Church in Rwanda.

We are able to achieve all this because of the support we receive from our brothers and sisters like you. **We all belong to the same family of this universal Catholic Church.** Through your support we can construct more classrooms and carry on our mission of imparting the Catholic education to our youth. Currently we have started the first Catholic school in the diocese, teaching computer science to empower the youth with modern technology so that they may be competitive in the job market.

We thank your Bishop and Fr. Steve for inviting our diocese to come and share our mission with you once every 3 years. I will be with you next weekend speaking at all the Masses. I invite you to be generous in your support. Envelopes will be in the pew next week for you to take home with you, consider your gift, and to put in the offering basket the next Sunday. Make your check out to St. Mary's as we will write one check for this.

THE WEDDING PROCESSION

Trivia question: How does the official Catholic rite of marriage describe the wedding procession?

First the mothers are seated. The priest comes in from the sanctuary. The groomsmen line up on one side up front. The organist starts a march. The bridesmaids, ring bearer and flower girl come down the main aisle. The bride comes last accompanied by her father. He lifts her veil, kisses her and hands her to the groom who escorts her to the kneelers in the sanctuary. Right?

Wrong. You score: 0. Well, you may get a few points for mentioning the center aisle.

Here's the actual text from the Rite of Marriage describing the procession: "If there is a procession to the altar, the ministers go first, followed by the priest, and then the bride and the bridegroom. According to local custom, they may be escorted by at least their parents and the two witnesses. Meanwhile, the entrance song is sung."

The "ministers" are the servers and the readers. Then the priest follows, accompanied by the deacon if one is assisting. Then the happy couple. The text gives you the impression that everyone comes down together. These are the ministers of the ceremony. They form one procession. The bride and groom come last because we generally put the presider at the end of the procession, and in marriage, it's the bride and groom who give this sacrament to each other. The rest of us, including the priest, are witnesses.

Local custom may permit at least two witnesses and parents to join the procession. "Parents" in the plural. The bridesmaids and groomsmen aren't mentioned specifically, though they're covered by that "at least" expression. The focus belongs on the couple, not on the witnesses. The father does not pass his daughter off to another male like a used sofa. All parents take part in the celebration. The organist does not play alone. The people who witness this marriage sing the opening song to begin their participation in the wedding. The bride is not the focus of the procession; the couple is;

Often we repeat traditions long after they've lost their meaning. In a society that praises equality of the married partners, this procession is a good idea waiting to happen.

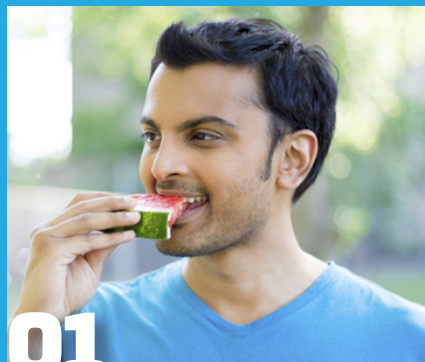


