FROM OUR PASTOR

When we hear the word "**pilgrimage**" in a religious conversation, most of us think of a journey to a *particular place*—maybe a town like Assisi, or Fatima, or an experience like *the Camino Walk* to Santiago de Compostella in Spain. (In fact—two of our parishioners—Beth and Kiersten Sabolik—as well as a priest friend of mine, have recently been on "The Camino"! Watch the movie "*The Way*" starring Martin Sheen.) These are life-giving experiences. But there is another type of "pilgrimage" that one of my Jesuit friends had to make that is even more connected to pilgrimage. In their religious formation, Jesuit candidates are to make a required *pilgrimage* as part of their process of entering the full life of that community. These young men discern with their elders a destination where they will go. They are then given \$35 and a *one-way bus ticket* to get to that place, and a month to figure out how to survive and to get back home. This has a very spiritual purpose, which is why it is a necessary part of their religious formation (and why it's among the many reasons that I'm not a Jesuit.).

Clearly nobody could undertake a journey like that all alone. As far as I know, everybody does survive. That's the point. There's no *pre-arranged plan* of where they will travel, whom they will meet, how they will spend their days and nights, and what will be the resources for their return trip. **It's an intensive course on how to become dependent on God and the goodness of others—and how to be in solidarity with all of those who live that way all the time through no choice of their own...**the homeless, the immigrant, the social outcast.

If you ever have occasion to visit with a member of the Jesuit order (of which Pope Francis is a member), ask him about his pilgrimage. No two are the same; some are astonishing stories. On that experience, he either learns to find community and mercy or he fails or he dies. The point is that **nobody finds God all by himself/herself.**

We live in a popular culture that tries to convince us otherwise—to say that *religion is a very private thing*-- a "*Me-And-Jesus*" thing—if in fact we choose to make it a *thing* at all. We are encouraged to believe that the Christian life is able to be lived *without* reference to community, and especially to the poor. That's just *not* true, and it certainly isn't anything that one can read out of the bible.

It is important to take notice of the fact that **the risen Lord Jesus never appeared to anybody all alone**, as he sometimes did during his earthly ministry. The surest way to mistake the truth of Christ alive was and is to try to do it all by yourself. The gospel of John tells us so.

We hear the story of "Doubting Thomas." He couldn't believe that Jesus had been raised from the dead, not because he was a cynic or an obstinately distrustful person—after all, resurrection is a pretty unlikely story for anybody to take in at first. No; it was because Thomas had *absented himself from the community* of fellow disciples on that Easter night. He wasn't there to see and to celebrate *what everybody else saw and celebrated*. And so, he refused to accept the truth of Jesus alive. His frame of mind makes perfect sense for one who was trying to understand things all by himself. **Without community, we can't do it**, just as Thomas couldn't.

Jesus' response was not to seek out Thomas for a *private* revelation. Jesus waited until Thomas came back to join his brothers in communion, when he appeared again. This time Thomas believed.

In the light of a gospel like this, it should come as little surprise that people who—for whatever reasons—are separated from the Christian community and especially from the celebration of Eucharist—have a much harder time holding on to Easter faith. To look out over the state of the world and of the institutional church these days, such as it is, the easy response is to say "*I will not believe until I can see the Lord himself.*" That is understandable enough. But it's **precisely here—in Eucharist and community—that the Lord discloses himself!** Here we are, as Christ's body—wounded but very much alive. And we too are **on pilgrimage together**, ever dependent upon God's Holy Spirit and the compassionate mercy of our fellow travelers. The Jesuits have something to teach us all.

We need each other, not only for many physical necessities of life, but **in order to recognize and affirm together the revelation of Christ in our midst.** May we not wander away to try that *on our own*, and may we be ever ready to *welcome those who have tried and been disappointed* in doing that, and who now seek a welcome here. This is at the heart of Easter faith and Easter work.

A few things to remember: Please pray for our Area Catholic Community of Belle River, Osakis and ourselves. We have our first meeting on Wednesday. Remember that there is a **GENERAL CHURCH CLEANING this next Saturday—the 25th—beginning at 8:30 AM.** It is a large church and commons area...and as we all know, many hands make light work. We need you!



LITURGICAL AND MUSICAL NOTES

To You Who Bring Small Children to Church

There you are sitting in worship or Bible study. Your child, or toddler, is restless. Perhaps they're even a little boisterous. You try to silence them, and nothing. You try to pacify them with food or toys, and nothing. Eventually, you resort to the last thing you wanted to do: you pick them up, and before a watching audience, you make the march out of the church. All the while, you're a little embarrassed. Maybe you're a little frustrated too. You might even think to yourself, "There's no point in coming to church. I get nothing out of it because I have to constantly care for my kid."

I want you — you mothers and/or fathers — to know just how encouraging you are to so many. The little elderly woman who often feels alone beams with a smile at the sight of you wrestling with your little one. She's been there before. She knows how hard it can be, but she smiles because to hear that brings back precious memories. To see young parents and their small children brighten her day, and she may have just received bad news this week about her health, but seeing the vitality of young ones removes — if but for a moment — her fears.

The older man who always seems to be grouchy notices you too. He's always talking about how children in this day have no respect or sense of good. But he sees you — a young family — in church, and you don't miss any gathering. Like clockwork, he can depend on the sight of you and your young family. You give him hope that maybe the church isn't doomed after all, because there are still young parents who love God enough to bring their restless children to worship.

Then there's everybody else. Some people will honestly become frustrated by noisy children in church. They have this warped idea that reverence includes absolute silence. It doesn't. When parents brought their children to Jesus, the disciples rebuked them (Matt. 19:13-15), but Jesus rebuked His disciples. He said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." The term translated "children" in Matthew and Mark is *paidon*. The root of the word "pedagogue" is from this word. It defined children of either an infant state, or more particularly, it was with reference to those who were half-grown and could be either males or females.

When Luke wrote his account of this narrative, he used the word *brephos*; which means "infants." Luke wasn't contradicting Matthew and Mark's account, because Luke wrote that they brought the infants "also" (Luke 18:15-17). They would have squirmed, maybe even cried. This was likely why the disciples rebuked the parents; as well as that they might have thought that the children were too young to understand the blessing Christ pronounced over them.

Bring your children to church. If you don't hear crying, the church is dying. As hard as it might be for you as a parent who's half-asleep, keep on doing what you're doing. You are an encouragement, and you're starting off your children's lives as you should.
