Bishop Kettler's letter:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The last six months have been a time of incredible challenge for our parishes and schools. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have adapted to new ways of worshiping, new ways of learning, new ways of "being Church" to one another. The evolving nature of the pandemic requires sound planning for the future that is adaptable to changing circumstances.

As parishes prepare to resume programming for youth and adults, the Diocese of St Cloud and its staff seek to be supportive resources. This includes providing a framework and guidance for re-opening. The "Parish/Diocesan Ministries COVID-19 Preparedness Guidance" document accompanying this letter seeks to ensure consistence across the diocese as well as the health and safety of youth, families, staff and other community members. It complements documents previously issued for worship and Catholic schools.

*In all areas of ministry, I am committed to following our state's safety protocols and public health mandates—not just because it's the law, but because it's the right thing to do. **Following these requirements is consistent with two important Catholic values: protecting human life and serving the common good.** While some pandemic requirements may seem burdensome and inconvenient, **we follow them because this is how we model Gospel values of care and compassion for others**, particularly our most vulnerable populations.*

We may not be able to do ministry the way we always have, but we shouldn't be doing less. The work of DREs, catechists and youth ministers is crucial now. We need to be innovative, creative and adaptable. Pastors and parish staff must support one another. Within our Area Catholic Communities and regions, please work together, collaborate and share resources whenever possible. Brainstorm new and effective ways to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with your parishioners.

By working together, we will be a stronger and better Church and a role model for others during this challenging time. May God bless you in your ministry.


Still, many can't relate the two commandments to our environment.

Opportunities for Stewardship


Under the Old Law that God gave to Moses, the Israelites were expected to tithe, that is give a tenth of their first fruits to the priests to support God's work. This was only the beginning, or minimum offering. Chapters 1 through 7 of Leviticus tells of other required and voluntary offerings. The Grain Offering was a memorial offering to God. A Fellowship, or thank offering to God was to be made with cattle, goats or sheep. An accidental sin required a young bull sacrifice under the Sin Offering. Also, there was a Penalty Offering for purification from sin. All of these offerings to God were made through a mediator ... the priests.

1 Timothy 2:5 tells us, "For there is one God, and there is one who brings God and mankind together, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself to redeem all mankind."

Today we still have the opportunity and responsibility to return to God a portion of the money God



The St. Mary's Board of Education has one opening beginning in September. Listed below is the nature and function of a Board of Education position. Call or stop by the Parish or School Office for an application if you are interested.

The Board of Education shall monitor and advise the total efforts of education in St. Mary's Parish, Alexandria, Minnesota, including St. Mary's School and youth through adult Faith Formation.

Duties and Functions:

1. Monitor and coordinate parish educational activities.
2. Act as a liaison body with local state school officials.
3. Create better understanding and support of Catholic education.
4. Evaluate policies of the parish educational programs as needed.
5. Be responsible for evaluating the effectiveness of the parish educational programs.
6. Review the development of annual budgets for all parish educational programs, which includes tuition rates, salary scales, and all other financial matters relating to education.
7. Have a Board member on planning and building committees for any new educational facilities.
8. Establish committees as need.
9. Aid the Pastoral Council in accomplishing its goals.
10. Implement policies recommended by the Diocese of St. Cloud.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

September 6, 2020 • 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time • Matthew 18:15–20

Words and Actions

Jesus tells his disciples if someone close to you sins against you, go to that person one-on-one and try to set things straight. If the person will not listen, bring someone else with you and confront the person. If that doesn't work, bring them in front of the whole church. If even that fails, let them go. Do not allow them to hurt you again.

As a church and as a family, we are responsible for each other's welfare. Loving my brother and sister as myself, the way Jesus commands, means being concerned not only for their physical welfare, but also their spiritual welfare. This is especially true in families.

As parents, we have been told that our children's faith formation is our responsibility. We help them grow in their faith by sharing what we believe about God and our church through our words and actions. Clearly, we have not only the right, but also the responsibility, to talk to our children and take action when they are doing something wrong.

Parents should also be aware that children are often capable of giving them the same guidance. Sometimes a child's words or actions offer a subtle insight into our own actions or lack of action. Without even meaning to, children can give us clear signals about how we are doing as their primary role model.

A young person acting out can sometimes be a clear warning sign that we are not spending enough time with them, or we are overindulging them. Sometimes it's their words that hit the mark.

"Why doesn't Daddy go to church?" or "How come we have so much, and other people have so little?"

For centuries, the Christian family has been called the domestic church. What holds true for

congregational churches also holds true for the church that gathers around the kitchen table. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (v. 20). We need to listen to our children's actions and words and remember that sometimes Jesus can speak very clearly through the words of a child.

FAMILY RESPONSE

Have a simple family reconciliation service. Talk about how easy it is to hurt the people closest to you. Say a prayer asking God to help you consider the ways you have hurt each other. Ask each person to write down or draw a picture of his or her offenses. Share what you have written and say you are sorry. (A parent should begin the process.) Close with a prayer.

PERSONAL RESPONSE

Is there anyone in your life who is hurting you and whom you need to confront? How can you be most effective in doing this? What do you want to remember from last week? What are you looking forward to next week? What are your concerns?


