





FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear People of St. Mary's,

Monday is Memorial Day. Mass will be at the Church at 8:30 AM. Come, pray for those who sacrificed for this country and then drive to the cemetery and pay your respects.

Effective THIS weekend, our governor and our bishop stated that all remaining capacity and physical-distancing limits will come to an end for Mass and other indoor parish events and gatherings. However, we will keep the **two back sections of the center aisle marked for safe-distance seating** for those who feel more vulnerable. We ask that you come early to be seated there, not with the "Alexandria Rush" as it is more difficult to accommodate a large number of people at the last minute. Many people have felt very safe here with our protocol; I want to make sure they still do. Masks are not required for those who have been *fully vaccinated* but are highly recommended for those not fully vaccinated out of charity toward others and their own safety. Continue to sanitize upon entering the building and as you approach the communion minister.

Communion will be distributed by six ministers, one for each section. The bishop strongly recommends that all Eucharistic Ministers be vaccinated, including the priest. If not, they must mask. This will be in effect for the immediate future. Even though receiving communion on the tongue is now permitted, most Eucharistic Ministers are very uncomfortable in placing the host on someone's tongue. The bishop recommends a special line. That being said, **whoever wants to receive communion on their tongue is asked to get into the priest's line for communion.** The other ministers will simply send you there to receive.

Other items about opening up more: The **Blessed Sacrament chapel** will open up fully this week. As of June 1, **confessions will be heard in the Reconciliation Room** in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel from **3:45 to 4:45 PM on Saturdays**. Fr. Matt, my successor, will hear confessions before weekday Masses *if* there is a sacristan to set up for Mass each day when he arrives.

We have to re-organize almost all of our ministries: servers, readers, communion ministers, hospitality ministers and sacristans. It will take some time to "get back" to some semblance of "normal," but we are starting. While funeral lunches and coffee and rolls may be permitted, having enough people to serve them may prove a challenge. Call if you are able to minister in some way. Everything will be phased in gradually as we get the volunteers. I have 4 weekends left here at St. Mary's until Fr. Matt assumes pastorship.

Thank you for following out protocol during this time. I am still cautious about opening up too quickly because I do not want another outbreak to occur. The virus is still among us and will be for the foreseeable future. We see how devastating the virus is in poorer countries like India as they cannot maintain social distance because of the dense population and with no access to a vaccine. This is what Bishop Kettler wrote on May 19: *"Vaccinations are the best approach for making continued progress against the virus and keeping people as safe as possible from its effects. Scientists and official health authorities have assured us that the current COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Pope Francis has stated that receiving one of these vaccines is not only permissible according to Catholic moral teaching but also part of our Gospel duty to protect life and care for our neighbors. I agree with what the Holy Father said earlier this year: "I think everyone must take the vaccine; it's the ethical option because you are playing with your health, your life, but you also are playing with the lives of others."*

Today, Trinity Sunday, celebrates the relationship between the three persons in one God...and that Spirit is shared with us. In other words, we were made in the image and likeness of God, created to be in relationship with one another in charity and love. Fr. Steve






MEMORIAL DAY MASS is scheduled for Monday, May 31 at 8:30 AM at the church, *not* the cemetery.

May 30, 2021 • Holy Trinity • Matthew 28:16-20

He Is With Us

Jesus has lived his life, died and risen. He has taught his disciples everything he had to teach. Before he leaves them for a final time, Jesus tells them to make disciples of the whole world, teaching all they had learned and baptizing in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Once heard a religious educator say that a disciple was like an apprentice. A disciple doesn't have to have it all together—she makes mistakes. She is someone who is still learning. An apprentice also needs mentoring. She needs someone to teach her and instruct her, but she also needs someone to show her how to be whatever it is she is apprenticing to be.

We are disciples of a Trinitarian God, baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit. Our way into the divine life of this Trinity is through Jesus. Jesus, the Son, is our brother, our savior and our mentor. He shows us how we can share in his divinity by teaching us to accept our humanity.

It was by living his life completely and embracing his death fully that Jesus became our way and our mentor. He accepted his limitations, and embraced his vulnerability. He showed us how to live through pain and loss and die with questions left unanswered. And through it all he shared his love with everyone: friends and enemies alike.

As disciples, we try, and sometimes fail, to live our lives as Jesus lived his, but like all good appren-

tices and disciples, we sometimes fail and have to try again. A great thing to remember is that Jesus is not just the ideal—someone we look up to and try to emulate—Jesus is our mentor. He walks with us, helping us clean up our messes. He constantly shares his love and his life with us so that we can share it with others.
