## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

Jesus uses the marriage covenant as His primary analogy for God's relationship with the Church. It is most fitting, then, that we hold up the Sacrament of Matrimony as the very image of God's undying love. Jesus sets the bar very high when questioned by the Pharisees, quoting and building upon the Book of Genesis: *"But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate."* The prohibition against divorce is an effort to make our human families reflect the union of the Trinity. God, who is ever faithful, joins spouses together. It is God's grace that keeps us in union with each other, not mere human force of will.

When troubles arise within marriage, it is good for us to keep this in mind: God sustains the marriage bond, we cooperate with His grace. We recognize that sometimes the marriage bond has not been properly forged, thus the allowance for a declaration of nullity (annulment) in these unfortunate cases. Yet we hold to our high standard for lifelong marriage because the world needs this witness of fidelity! St. Mark's Gospel notes Jesus' disdain for the Mosaic Law's permission of divorce, that it was only allowed because of the hardness of human hearts. We seek to have more gentle hearts, to endure our trials and tribulations with gentleness, compassion, and mutual understanding. I applaud those of you who have given witness to fidelity within marriage for so many decades, and I pray for those who struggle. We need your witness, as difficult as it can sometimes be.

If you are struggling with difficulties in your marriage, I encourage you to seek out wise counsel from other holy married persons and from professional counselors. I am happy to help as much as I am able, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation; while I may not have any marriage experience of my own, I have been blessed to know many couples who have fought through great challenges and come out stronger in the end. Most of all, I encourage you to pray for each other, pray with your spouses, pray with your children. For if it is God who has bound you together, then it is also His grace that will sustain your bond.





## Breast Cancer: *Things You Should Know*

There are things you should know to understand what breast cancer is, know your chances for getting it, and how to find it early. Finding breast cancer early is critical because when it is found early, it is easier to treat. Read to learn more about the common symptoms of breast cancer and the best way many women find breast cancer early.

### What is breast cancer?

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer among women, after skin cancer. It is a disease in which cells in the breast grow out of control.

Cancer cells can also spread, or *metastasize*, to other parts of the body.



### What symptoms should I look for?

Some warning signs of breast cancer are:

- New lump in the breast or underarm (armpit).
- Thickening or swelling of part of the breast.
- Irritation or dimpling of breast skin.
- Redness or flaky skin in the nipple area or the breast.
- Pulling in of the nipple.
- Nipple discharge other than breast milk, including blood.
- Any change in the size or shape of the breast.
- Pain in the breast.

These symptoms can happen with other conditions that are not cancer. If you notice any of these symptoms, talk to your health care provider right away.

### What can I do to find breast cancer early?

**Breast cancer screening** involves checking a woman's breasts for cancer before there are signs or symptoms of the disease.

A *mammogram* is an X-ray picture of the breast. Doctors use a mammogram to look for early signs of breast cancer. The United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommends that most women who are at average risk and are 50 to 74 years old get one every 2 years. USPSTF recommendations state that women with a parent, sibling, or child with breast cancer are at a higher risk for breast cancer and may benefit from beginning screening in their 40s. Weighing the benefits and risks of screening is important when considering your screening options. If you're 40 to 49 years old, talk to your health care provider about when to start screening.



## Are you concerned that you cannot afford to have a mammogram?

Most health insurance plans cover the cost of screening mammograms. If you have a low income or do not have insurance, you may qualify for a free or low-cost mammogram through CDC's National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program.

## What can I do to lower my chance of getting breast cancer?

One of the most important things you can do to lower your risk of breast cancer is to know your risk of breast cancer. Talk to your doctor about what that means for you.

Your doctor will consider factors that **cannot** be changed, like:

- Your personal history of breast problems.
- Your family's history of breast cancer.
- Your breast density (the amount of connective and fatty tissue in your breasts).
- Your age. Most breast cancers are found after age 50.
- Your menstrual and childbirth history.
- Your history of radiation treatment therapy to the chest or breasts.
- If you took the drug diethylstilbestrol (DES), which was given to some pregnant women in the United States between 1940 and 1971 to prevent miscarriage, you have a higher risk. Women whose mothers took DES while pregnant with them are also at higher risk.
- If you or close family members have known mutations (changes) in your breast cancer genes (BRCA1 or BRCA2). Women who have inherited these genetic changes are at higher risk of breast and ovarian cancer. You will only know if you have a mutation if you have had genetic testing. Even in the absence of having abnormal genes when tested, it is important to know your family history; we don't know all the genes that cause breast cancer.

Your doctor will also consider factors that **can** be changed, like any hormone replacement use.

## Here are some things you can do to reduce your chance of getting breast cancer:

- Keep a healthy weight.
- Engage in regular physical activity.
- Don't drink alcohol, or limit alcoholic drinks to no more than one per day.

# BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

October 3, 2021 • 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time • Mark 10:13–16

## Let the Children Come To Me

*People began to bring their children to Jesus so that he could bless them. The disciples rebuked them thinking Jesus had better things to do. Jesus became indignant and told them to let the children come to him for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.*

When Jesus tells us that the kingdom of God belongs to those who are like children, I think the youngsters he has in mind are those wide-eyed tykes whose faces tell you just how they feel.

You know the type—the little ones who pull on your hand and stretch your arm in their eagerness to get somewhere. I think children like this must come from homes where they are loved and really cared for. They live their lives certain that comfort and safety are no farther away than a parent's lap.

Childhood, particularly early childhood, can be a scary time—a time of almost total dependence. Left on his own, a three-year-old's life would be extremely hazardous. But then again, left on our own, we could all find life pretty treacherous —whether we're three, thirty-three or sixty-three.

Perhaps that is what Jesus is trying to tell us. Life is not easy: It is filled with all sorts of obstacles and problems, but no matter our age, we are all children, children of God.

We, too, need to live our lives aware that when we are open to God's love, we are safe and secure, loved and cared for, always close to the lap of God.

When we realize and accept our dependency on an all-loving God and accept God's love, we can

glide through some of our fear and insecurity. We can let that wide-eyed, smiling child inside each of us come out to play.

Continually remind yourself of God's promise to be with you always. Let the child in you out, and spend time as a family playing together. Reach for your child's hand, stretching his arm in your eagerness to share God's love through your own laughter and joy.
