## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

*Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep."*

Works of mercy, acts of loving service, are an integral part of our lives as Christians. Like Peter, we need to respond to Jesus in love; our response, like his, must be more than mere words. Words are important, but they must be accompanied by acts of love.

Jesus asked Peter to renew his love three times because Peter had denied Jesus three times after declaring that he would gladly die with Jesus. Peter had failed to back up his words with courageous actions. Now Jesus was asking him to place his very life at the service of the Gospel. God had blessed Peter with gifts of leadership, and those gifts were needed by the Church; his gifts were part of God's plan. So, too, are we asked to back up our declaration of faith and love for Jesus with courageous actions. Our lives and our gifts are as important to God's plan for the Church and the world as were those of the Apostles!

Moreover, our works of service, our sharing of our God-given talents and resources, cannot be a mere add-on to our lives, something we do when we have "extra" time or money. We are *Christians*; our relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church defines us more deeply than any other reality. Stewardship of our gifts is integral to the Christian life. This is why we describe our philosophy of charitable action as "Stewardship as a way of life." God has entrusted to us a portion of His Divine Mission to heal, to govern, to sanctify, and to build up His Body the Church. This is so central to what we are called to do that we made it the first part of our ACC Mission Statement: **"To build God's Church** across generations by living the Eucharist."

Jesus' words to Peter echo down through the ages to us now: *"Do you love me? Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Feed my sheep."* This is the way in which Jesus wants us to show our love for Him: by caring for the needs of the people God so deeply loves. Every gift we have is for this purpose. Every human person is loved by God; our part is to make that love known and felt by how we use our time, talent, and treasures for these beloved children of God. May we have the courage to respond, like Saint Peter, with lives of passionate witness and service to those in need.

### JUSTICE, PEACE & INTEGRITY OF CREATION (JPIC)

#### Reflection from Hope Haven Participant, Leon Breun:

As I look back and reflect on the Homeless to Hope program, I can't help but think about how fortunate I have been to have always had a place to call home. At the first information meeting I was shocked at how prevalent homelessness is in the Alexandria area. In relaying the information to the Knights of Columbus, it got very quiet when I told them that up to 30 people a month were in need of shelter. This awareness translated into 11 Knights volunteering for the overnight stays which were part of the program.

I have always had the belief that if there is a true need, good people will always step up in some way to fulfill that need. The reaction of the parish in filling all of the needed volunteer spots confirms this belief once again. Because of the awareness that JPIC brought to all of us in the community, homelessness will be looked at with more compassion and less contempt. All of us receive help and support in different ways as we make our way through life here on earth. The small sacrifices each of us make are nothing compared to the temporary needs of the homeless we have served.

I pray that God's graces flow to those who work with people in need on a daily basis and also to the people who made this parish aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters. They are truly Christ among us.

**MONTH 4 — “I had a dream!”** My brain has begun maturing - a process that will continue until I am 14 years old. My eyelids are now sealed and will re-open at 7 months. My taste buds are now working.

Nutrients consumed by my mother are passed on to me within an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to me via the umbilical cord. Fine hair has begun to grow on my head, eyebrows, and eyelashes. Facial expressions like my parents can be seen at this time. This month REMS (rapid eye movements) have been recorded - a sign of dreaming. I am now about 9 inches in length. Thank you for praying!

**THANK YOU** to all who donated to the Catholic Relief Services Collection and to the Rice Bowl program in this challenging time. On behalf of those who benefit from your kindness and generosity, our heartfelt gratitude!

**GRAVE MATTERS** Your cemetery committee, along with parish volunteers, do every task we can practically manage ourselves to save money. This includes the work day many of you have been asking about. The **spring work day is Saturday, May 21, 8:00 AM - 12:00 PM**. Mark your calendars and pray for no snow!!

In the past we have obtained prices from monument companies to come in and straighten an individual monument. On an individual basis, the cheapest estimate we have received is \$1,500, which isn't unreasonable considering everything involved.

To mitigate this expense, we have purchased a lift to straighten monuments and rows ourselves. A \$500 grant from the Rural Electric Association (REA) Round Up program will help pay for the lift, which will be delivered in late May. The intent is to lift leaning monuments and straighten the monument rows. If all goes as planned, a shovel of dirt will be the heaviest a volunteer will lift. Cleaning the monuments that have rust, moss, and lichens is planned as time permits.

Our plan is not to charge for these services. There is often no one to bill for the oldest monuments and, also, we don't want to single out a family without the financial resources by not doing needed work on their monuments. We are depending on the generosity of everyone to donate what they can in time or money to cover expenses of these operations. Please be generous with the talents and treasures entrusted to you by God.



# Stewardship

**T**ithing is part of the larger principle that followers of Jesus know as Christian stewardship. Tithing is important, but is only one part of that broader concept. The idea of Christian stewardship, in contrast to the tithe, includes three basic principles: *God is the owner of all of life; each individual is a steward of all that God has entrusted to us; and, each person must give an accounting of their stewardship.*

It is important for those who tithe to clearly perceive the relationship of their regular giving to the rest of the dedication that they make to God.

## Time and talents

While in its narrow sense, tithing refers to the setting aside of a tenth of one's income for God's work. It has nevertheless been true that others, as they have practiced the stewardship of their money, have felt the urgent need to dedicate their time, talents, and their lives to God, as well.

The nature of tithing is such that the tither quickly understands this larger concept of stewardship. Tithing is an acknowledgement of God's ownership, and of God's continued concern for the world. Giving a percentage of what is earned as an act of worship is a recognition that all the remainder has been given by God to us.

## How money is earned

As part of their larger stewardship, tithers are concerned with the ways by which they earn money and with the use of the nine-tenths that remains after they set aside a tithe.

Christian stewards do not shape all their efforts and desires to increased material goods, even if they do put aside a tenth of the larger funds that such efforts bring to them.

The Christian who endeavors to be a



steward of all they possess will naturally be concerned with the motives that drive them as they seek to make their living. They will always bring the purposes and methods by which they earn money under the light of Christ's teachings.

## Use of other money

Nor can Christian stewards fail to be concerned with the use they make of the rest of their money after they have tithed. They cannot live as if that amount is their own. Stewardship requires a sense of obligation for all the money that comes into the possession of a follower of Jesus.

In the light of such stewardship, a Christian will often give a larger proportion of their income than a tenth to God's work. The tithe is an acknowledgement, and a historic measure, but it was never




therefore the church shall not be involved!”

### **Use of time**

As part of total stewardship, tithers are also concerned about how they use their time. The days and years at their disposal is a sacred trust. They are stewards of time as long as they live.

People in the 21st century are aware of the significance of time as never before in human history. The idea that this is a leisurely and unhurried existence has been replaced by a rush to accomplish everything immediately, as if there might not be a tomorrow in which to do it.

Time is holy because it may be limited. Christian stewards who are faithful in the use of their time do not live in fear of the future, but constantly face the question of whether or not they are making wise use of the years at their disposal. They ask themselves, "Am I being true to God if I devote all my time to work, pleasure and sleep, even if I do tithe my money?"

### **Dedication of talents**

Then, as part of their total stewardship, tithers are thoughtful about the dedica-

tion of their talents. They regard personal abilities to work and to lead as another evidence of God's loving care. In a spirit of consecration they desire to have those talents utilized in business, in the home, and during leisure hours, in such a manner that they will make a contribution to the Kingdom of God on earth.


## LUKE'S LATEST LITURGICS





Changes in appetite


