Throughout the history of the Church, the ministry to the homebound has been a major part of the works of mercy in parish life. The mission of The Church of St. Mary is:

“To build God’s Church across generations by Living the Eucharist.”

We celebrate the Eucharist as the source and summit of our faith, praying as Christ did — we share the Eucharist so all may be one, whether sick, elderly or homebound.



The purpose of this ministry is to gain greater awareness of our homebound parishioners, to recognize their tremendous contributions to the church, and to provide opportunities that allow them to experience closer ties with our parish family.

GOALS

The goals of this program are:

SACRAMENTAL

- To bring the Eucharist to those who are sick, elderly or homebound and unable to attend Mass in person
- To refer the elderly, sick or homebound to the Faith Community Nurse or Parish Priest as needed for sacraments or health support

SPIRITUAL

- To share prayer
- To bring bulletins
- To accept prayer requests
- To provide care notes, prayer cards, prayer shawls, and devotional items
- To include the homebound in the parish prayer activities and parish-related projects and organizations

CHARITABLE

- To provide service by performing: errands, correspondence, cognitive activities, telephone check-ins and visits
- To encourage other parish organizations, Faith Formation students, and St. Mary’s School students to participate in this program
- To remember the homebound at special occasions, such as, birthdays, Christmas, anniversaries, special liturgical celebrations, etc.
