Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion | MARCH 24, 2024

Holy Week. It is a great honor that I may write a message this week. Still, what can I write which can do it justice within such a small space? As the name says, this week is the most sublime, the most holy of all weeks. This is because it is the finale and new beginning; what we have been preparing for all of Lent – the origin of new life in Christ. We may start Lent thinking of ourselves (let's be honest, we're more likely not even thinking of ourselves, but our immoderate attachments which cry out and complain as we fast and abstain). We think of our sinfulness one way or another, but by now, here at the end of Lent, we hopefully have at least used some of God's grace to make an opening for more.

The purpose of Lent isn't to lose weight, or save money, or even be a good person. As Archbishop Sheen says, "Jesus did not come to make us nice people, He came to make us new men!" Thus, having required us to confront our weakness and sinfulness for weeks, we come to better know the terrifying scope and scale of our need: as humans we are good, but we are not good at being human, and even our most strenuous efforts cannot fix that -- but rather than leave us to despair, the Church shows us the Gospel, the good news, that Jesus can.

And not only does she show us, as though it were an old story in a book or a play on a stage, real in our imaginations but not in fact; she opens not only our minds but the mysteries, for us to enter into, and be changed.

We begin today, of course, with Palm Sunday. We are not play acting when we read the gospel of Jesus' triumphal entry and then his Passion, we are hearing the words of the Apostles who witnessed it, the story that began then of which we are now a part. Our sins are the reason He came to die. But that's not all.

On Holy Thursday, and throughout Holy Week, we do not see Our Lord losing control, but decisively choosing to love. The Last Supper is not something that is interrupted by the Passion, nor is it a bittersweet, sentimental attempt to make himself feel better before it. It is the beginning of the greatest longing of His heart, "with great desire I have desired to share this Passover with you." And it was a Passover like none other. At the same time he kept and fulfilled the old covenant, He established the new with the new sacrifice in his Blood, and ordaining the new priesthood to offer it until the end of time. Thus, by sharing his priesthood, we may have life everlasting. This unity of us with Him is the 'joy for which he endured the Cross.'

The way we become united is in and through the sacred mysteries, the Sacraments. The first of these is baptism: the Blood and water which poured forth from his side wash us and raise us to new life, and thus the Church is born by redeeming sinners, His life for ours, so that ours are His; "no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me."

The Easter Vigil and the whole octave following is centered around this wondrous portal, this rebirth. Catechumens become Christians and we, the Church, the Bride of Christ, renew our vows. These mysteries are called such not because they are dark or need solving, but because they are infinite light and we cannot ever completely comprehend them; they do not fit in us, we enter into them, like entering a cloud; we cannot grasp the cloud, but we breathe it in; we cannot see everything, but we can hold His hand and follow him on the greatest adventure as He leads us home through it

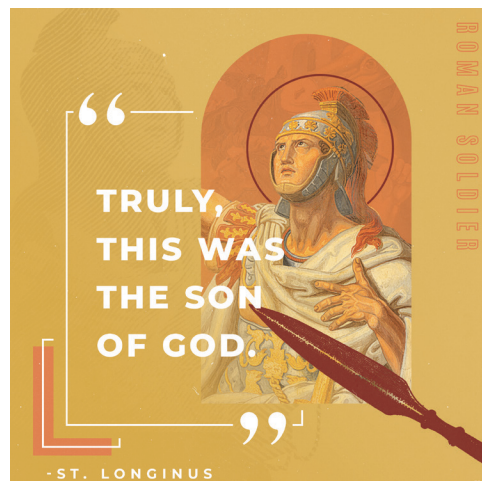
